Google Workspace for Education

Summary

Google Workspace for Education (WfE) administrators manage which Core and Additional Services their users can access with their accounts. This guide is to help parents understand how Bishopswood school uses Google services, what information Google gets when they use these services, and how Google uses that information.

Google Workspace for Education offers two categories of Google services: Core Services (like Drive, and Classroom) that are provided under our school's Google Workspace for Education agreement, and Additional Services (like YouTube, Maps, and Blogger) that can be used with Google Workspace for Education accounts.

At Bishopswood each child has a WfE account which is primarily used to log into Chromebooks to access software for the child's learning. All WfE accounts used by children are marked as an "under 18" user.

Parent or guardian consent where appropriate

Bishopswood school provides consent for Core Services on parents' behalf by signing up for and using these Google Workspace for Education services. These comprise:

Google Workspace for Education requires in its agreement (section 2.5) that schools obtain parent or guardian consent for any Additional Services they allow students under the age of 18 to use. Bishopswood School do not enable any Additional Services for any of the student's accounts.
