

Household Support Fund: support for families this winter

On 30 September 2021, the government announced that vulnerable households across the country will be able to access a new £500 million support fund to help them with essentials over the winter. This funding covers the period 6 October 2021 to 31 March 2022 inclusive. The Household Support Fund will be distributed by councils in England to directly help those who need it most.

Oxfordshire County Council sent us this information:

Ahead of the February half-term holiday, families of eligible children and young people in Oxfordshire early years settings, schools and colleges will once again receive support with the costs of food during the holiday period, funded by the Department of Work and Pensions' Household Support Fund.

As you will be aware, in normal circumstances funding is not available for food support outside of term-time and we expect this funding to cease after Easter 2022.

£25 per eligible child is available for the February holiday period. Your child's school will provide the support to you in the form of a supermarket voucher or equivalent.

Eligible children in schools are those entitled to a benefits related Free School Meal.
