Columba Class News

Hello from Columba Class! We have been extremely busy this term learning about plants and minibeasts in our topic *Gardens*. We have planted seeds and beans and are watching them grow. We planted broad beans in a clear bag so that we could see the roots and shoots coming out. The children have worked on two stories this term: 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We used these books to look at links between stories and talk about preferences.

Columba Class have gone for walks around Sonning Common Primary's grounds looking for different living things. They collected plant materials, turning them into natural crowns, and hunted for minibeasts. Continuing on from our work on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', we looked after five caterpillars. We enjoyed seeing them grow quickly and create their chrysalides. We now have beautiful painted lady butterflies in our butterfly garden, ready to release before half term.

The class have enjoyed many sensory activities and fine motor control games. In maths, we have started using the mathematical language around addition.

Recently, we have started to learn about The Queen and her Platinum Jubilee. The children made gold crowns and decorated The Queen's silhouette with pictures of things associated with her and London. We are also planning a tea party to celebrate.

We have had a lovely term exploring our theme of “keeping healthy”. We have listened to the story “Head To Toe” and practiced copying different actions and really enjoyed the sensory story “Tree”. This has helped us learn about the weather and the different seasons. We learnt about how dew forms and had fun using the spray bottle to create our own dew.

As always we have enjoyed cooking and are becoming fabulous at creating fruit kebabs and salads - our chopping, grating, threading and peeling skills are really improving. Pupils have worked hard at following the symbol recipes too.

We are focussing well on Waldon type tasks and are learning about “time” in maths; we are able to sequence events in the day and are starting to work on identifying o'clock times.

In art, we have learnt about surrealism and have enjoyed creating some unusual compositions and mixing themes using a range of media.

We are progressing well in phonics and always enjoy mark making in a range of sensory textures.





Household Support Fund: support for families this Spring

Bishopswood School will provide this support to you in the form of a supermarket voucher or equivalent.

Eligible children are those entitled to a benefits related Free School Meal.
